This year marks 125 years since fifteen people gathered together in a Palmerston North home to form a local Baptist church. While the actual anniversary was in late February, our official celebrations will take place at Labour Weekend, October 25 -27, 2019.

- God for his grace, faithfulness and provision down through the decades;
- the rich inheritance which we have received from the efforts and answered prayers of the various Palmerston North Baptists over many generations;
- the service of our ministers / pastors and missionaries over 125 years; and
- the original heart and spirit which God has for our community, and get glimpses of the future at Central Baptist.

The weekend will inspire all past and present members of our community at Central Baptist.

The semi-formal and informal sessions are interspersed with free time to catch up with old and new friends.

There will be an opportunity to visit the old church, and other places connected with the early days of our church.

Guest Preacher

Grant Harris, Senior Pastor of Windsor Park Baptist Church, chaplain to the Sky Sports New Zealand Breakers Basketball team and son of Noel & Noeline Harris, will preach at the Sunday worship service. Grant and his wife Joanne (nee Cleland) grew up in Central Baptist.

A Legacy For The Future

For 125 years, Central Baptist Church has had a proud history of connecting and supporting our local community. This has been done in big ways like the formation of Te Aroha Noa, and more recently the Agapanthus Trust providing accommodation for refugees. And in many smaller ways such as visiting the elderly, tutoring refugees, lunches for schools, supporting people with budgeting and financial advice.

Two years ago, we purchased the neighbouring property at 200 Church Street (the old Woolworths or Dress for Less building) so that we can increase the community contribution which we make. In 1944, the proceeds from our 50th Jubilee cleared the remaining debt on our previous church building. We will use any donations (tax deductible) and proceeds on the occasion of our 125th Anniversary towards reducing the debt on the 200 Church Street property.

"Market Place"

During the weekend, there will be preserves and hand crafts for sale. Proceeds will go to the debt repayment of the 200 Church Street property and mission funds in Thailand.

AN APPEAL FOR FUNDS FOR RESTORATION OF A BIBLE DONATED TO PNBC IN 1928



In preparation for our *CBC 125* celebrations, we've been getting treasures or taonga out from our archives, including a Bible which was gifted just over 90 years ago to our Palmerston North Baptist Church (PNBC). There is quite a story behind this Bible.

In the front of this Bible, there is an inscription in beautiful calligraphy:

Sent by Miss M Moore for the (Palmerston North Baptist) Church on the occasion of the opening of the new church building. The cover is of olive wood from Mt Hermon and has the Crusader's Cross carved in the front. Miss Moore joined the Church in 1926 and left in 1928 as a missionary to the Jews in Palestine.

Who was Miss M Moore?

Marion Moore was born in 1872 in Central Otago during the height of the gold rush days. After training as a teacher, she taught as an infant mistress at several schools in the North Island, including at Feilding and Central School in Palmerston North. With an intense interest in the welfare of her pupils and an expert knowledge of specialised aspects of teaching, Marion had an outstanding reputation in her profession. She did not marry.

Marion suffered from ill health in her later years and as a result, she retired from teaching in her mid-50s when in Palmerston North. While her family was Anglican, Marion formally joined our church in 1926 when she was baptised at the age of 54. Two years later and at her own expense, she attended the World Missionary Conference in Jerusalem. For the next three years, Marion engaged in fearless and strenuous missionary work including during the 1929 riots between Jews and Arabs in Jerusalem. She also worked in Cairo and at the Soldier's Canteen at Ismailia (Suez Canal). In spite of declining health, Marion subsequently returned to the same region in 1936.

In Palmerston North, Marion held positions of leadership within several professional and Christian organisations, such as the Women's Christian Temperance Union and the British & Foreign Bible Society. She was also involved in the early days of the Bible in Schools League in the city.

At PNBC, Marion was a Sunday School teacher and at the annual Easter Camps held at the Showgrounds for members of the Baptist Young Women's Bible Classes, she was an extremely popular Camp Mother.

Widely known throughout New Zealand as a delegate and a speaker at conferences, Marion was held in very high esteem for her missionary and other work. She never spared herself in her strenuous service of others and using her talents and gifts for her Lord. Here at our PNBC, she was a much loved and devoted member and when she died in 1937, there was an exceptionally large attendance at her funeral. Her death was widely reported in newspapers around the whole country.

Marion inspired a next generation of missionaries, including Alyson Shearer who served in Lebanon and Syria. In turn, decades later at our church's centenary celebrations, Alyson connected with the next generation, Steph C, prior to her departure to the same mission field.

Why is this Bible significant and why should it be restored?

Due to water damage to our early church archives when in storage at our previous church site, this Bible is one of a few remaining items from our first few decades. It speaks of our early days and our church's story; people and connections; and of one of our early missionaries and the impact which she had.

Unfortunately, the Bible is in bad condition and a large amount of time would be involved if it was to be professionally restored. A leading book restoration expert has given us a quote of \$2,350 for the work. In his experience, it is a unique Bible and one which needs to be "saved". This one-off expense is not covered in this year's annual budget.

The book restorer has offered to put aside other work in order to restore our Bible in time for our Labour weekend celebrations. He has also generously extended to us the option of a 6 month payment, provided that we go back to him **by Sunday 25 August with a decision on whether to proceed with the work.**
